



Hawai'i Online Pro bono (HOP) is an easy way to get your civil legal questions answered. This is a free web based service for income qualified individuals. Once qualified, you can post your civil legal question so a volunteer attorney can respond. You will receive an email when you receive a response to your question.

How much do I have to pay?

Nothing! HOP is a no cost service for low-income individuals who meet minimum income and asset requirements.

How often can I use this service?

Individuals using HOP are limited to asking three separate legal questions per year.

Can I ask a criminal question?

No. Questions about criminal cases or charges cannot be answered on HOP.

How do I get started?

Visit Hawaii.FreeLegalAnswers.org and follow the steps on the front of this flyer.

What if I don't have internet access?

If you do not have internet access, you can go to a public library and use it for free.

Is HOP confidential?

Yes. All questions asked on HOP are protected by attorney-client privilege.

What if the volunteer attorney is unable to answer my question online?

If it appears as though your question cannot be answered online, you may be referred to a local legal service agency to assist you with your legal issue.

Step 1

See if you qualify.

Answer a few questions to see if you qualify for this service. If you qualify, register your account.



Step 2

Check your email.


You'll receive an email telling you when you've received a response from a volunteer attorney.



Step 3

Ask a question.

Ask our volunteer attorneys a specific question about your civil legal issue.



Step 4

Log back in.

See the response to your question; ask more questions.
